RECORD OF PROCEEDINGS MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING JANUARY 8TH, 2009

The Medina Township Board of Trustees met in regular session at the Medina Township Hall on January 8th, 2009, to conduct the business of the Township. President Wilkins called the meeting to order at 6:30 pm with the following Trustees in attendance: Rita M. Holt and Mead Wilkins. Also in attendance were the Fiscal Officer, Police Chief, Fire Chief, Asst. Zoning Inspector and the general public.

Roll Call

Mr. Wilkins asked for a roll call of all members present. Trustees present were Mrs. Holt and Mr. Wilkins. Mr. Todd arrived at 6:35 pm.

Mr. Wilkins led the Pledge of Allegiance.

PUBLIC COMMENT

Mr. Wilkins motioned to open the floor for public comment. Mrs. Holt seconded the motion.

Melanie Sindelar, County Auditors Office, said tax bills will be late due to the state rates coming back late. She also left brochures regarding foreclosure counseling.

Mrs. Holt motioned to close the floor for public comment. Mr. Wilkins seconded the motion.

SITE PLANS

Tri-County J.O.G./Next Step - Site - 3711 Pearl Road

Mr. Wilkins motioned to accept the recommendation of the Zoning Commission and approve the change of use for Tri-County J.O.G. located at 3711 Pearl Road as presented. Mrs. Holt seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Wilkins and Mrs. Holt.

Westfield Bank - Site - 5000 Foote Road

Mr. Wilkins motioned to accept the recommendation of the Zoning Commission and approve the expansion for Westfield Bank located at 5000 Foote Road in The Hoffman Building, as presented. Mr. Todd seconded the motion: Voting aye thereon: Mr. Wilkins, Mr. Todd and Mrs. Holt.

Fenn Center - Site - 3823 Pearl Road

Mr. Wilkins motioned to accept the recommendation of the Zoning Commission and approve the alterations for Fenn Center located at 3823 Pearl Road as presented, which is an addition of a covered walk. Mrs. Holt seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Wilkins, Mrs. Holt and Mr. Todd.

OTHER BUSINESS

Approval of Payroll

Mr. Wilkins motioned to approve payroll checks #12644 to #12713 totaling \$47,305.46 with \$5,058.00 in deductions. Mrs. Holt seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Wilkins, Mrs. Holt and Mr. Todd.

Approval of Appropriations Transfers

Mr. Wilkins motioned to approve the total appropriations transfer of \$29,070.00 (document is incorporated into minutes). Mrs. Holt seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Wilkins, Mrs. Holt and Mr. Todd.

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OTHER BUSINESS CON'T

Approval of 2008 Purchase Orders

Mr. Wilkins motioned to approve purchase orders for health insurance and property/liability insurance totaling \$40,525.98 and operating supplies totaling \$2,000.00 (document is incorporated into minutes). Mr. Todd seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Wilkins, Mr. Todd and Mrs. Holt.

Mr. Wilkins asked Mrs. George about the closing out of the budget. Mrs. George said she is almost finished closing out the budget for 2008. She will establish a temporary 2009 budget until she meets with the department heads to see what they need for 2009. Mrs. George also discussed the necessity to send a letter to Mr. Thorne seeking his advice on where to put the funds in the "miscellaneous special revenue fund" established by previous Fiscal Officers. The Auditors were unable to determine where the money came from.

Check for Health Savings Accounts

Mrs. George said the employee portion of the Health Savings Accounts is due January 15, 2009, so she has to cut the check and will need two Trustees to sign it. It will be approved at the next meeting.

Approval of Minutes

Mr. Wilkins motioned to approve the December 26, 2008, regular meeting minutes. Mrs. Holt seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Wilkins, Mrs. Holt and Mr. Todd.

Mr. Wilkins motioned to approve the January 5, 2009, organizational minutes. Mr. Todd seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Wilkins, Mr. Todd and Mrs. Holt.

REPORTS

Zoning Department

The Assistant Zoning Inspector stated that there were 7 permits issued for the month of December 2008, as follows:

Police Report

The Police Chief reported that for the month of December the department responded to 969 calls for service as follows: 32 criminal acts, 62 accidents, 248 enforcement and 627 miscellaneous calls.

Mr. Wilkins motioned to accept the departmental reports as read. Mr. Todd seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Wilkins, Mr. Todd and Mrs. Holt.

Cemetery Restoration

Mr. Todd motioned to appropriate \$18,000.00 for the restoration of the Hamilton Corners Cemetery for payment to Kurt Leahey, for that project. Mr. Wilkins seconded the motion. Mr. Wilkins asked if it was possible to have parking there. Mr. Todd said there was no way to have parking. Mrs. Holt inquired about burials there and Mr. Wilkins said there were no maps or plats for the cemetery because they were removed from the townhall many years ago so there can be no burials. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Todd, Mr. Wilkins and Mrs. Holt.

This item was tabled.

Mr. Wilkins is still trying to reach Ms. Pischek and has not been able to reach her.

Fire Alarm at Maintenance Building

Mr. Wilkins said the Fire Alarm Maintenance Contract is being reviewed with Mr. Thome.

Fire Department Staffing

This item was tabled.

Addendum to Organizational Minutes - Changes to Schedule of Fees

Mrs. Holt motioned to make the following changes to the Zoning Appendix V Schedule of Fees as follows:

2. All other residential construction or alteration

\$50.00 + \$.05 sf

3. Ponds, decks, pools and hot tubs

\$35.00

G. BUSINESS

Temporary construction trailer \$50.00 fee + \$250.00 Deposit (deposit is returned when the trailer is removed within 6 months. Permit renewal is required)

I. SIGNS

- 4. Temporary Sign/Banner \$50.00 fee + \$250.00 Deposit (deposit is returned when temporary sign/banner is removed, within 14 days)
- 5. Penalty fee for failure to obtain sign permit prior to construction, total fee will be doubled.

Voting aye thereon: Mr. Wilkins, Mrs. Holt and Mr. Todd. The Board entered into Executive Session at 7:08 pm. The Board reconvened at 7:47 pm. No decisions were made during that meeting.

Rescinding of Pay Rates for the Fire Department

Mrs. Holt motioned to rescind everything with the wages on the Fire Department from our Organizational Meeting except for the Records Clerk/Part-time Secretary, Julie. Mr. Todd seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mrs. Holt, Mr. Todd and Mr. Wilkins.
