RECORD OF PROCEEDINGS MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING MARCH 18TH, 2010

The Medina Township Board of Trustees met in regular session at the Medina Township Hall on March 18th, 2010, to conduct the business of the Township. President Todd called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm with the following Trustees in attendance: Michel D. Todd, Sarah (Sally) Gardner and Ray Jarrett. Also in attendance were the Fiscal Officer, Police Chief, Fire Chief, Zoning Inspector and the general public.

Roll Call

Mr. Todd asked for a roll call of all members present. Trustees present were Mr. Todd, Mrs. Gardner and Mr. Jarrett.

Pledge of Allegiance

Mr. Todd led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Moment of Silence

Mr. Todd asked for a moment of silence for our military personnel at home and overseas specifically for Gunny Sergeant, Robert Gilbert who was killed in Afghanistan, Elyria Officer James Kerstetter who was shot in the line of duty, Cleveland Heights Police Officer Thomas Patton who had a heart attack during a foot chase and State Highway Patrol Officer, Andrew Baldridge who was killed in a car accident on his way to a call.

State Fire Marshall Heroism Award

State Fire Marshall Cooper presented Jim Melillo, Medina Township Resident, with the State Fire Marshall's Award for Heroism for his selfless act of heroism in saving the life of Susan Haury whose vehicle was entangled with another burning vehicle. Mr. Melillo along with Medina Township Police Officer Matthew Ventura took the boat he was hauling off his truck and proceeded to pull the vehicles apart. Mrs. Gardner also presented him with an award from the Medina Township Trustees. Mr. Todd stated that this was truly an act of selfless service because Mr. Melillo did not want any recognition. Chief Arbogast said Officer Matthew Ventura was first on the scene with Mr. Melillo and using fire extinguishers proceeded to put out the fire. Mr. Jarrett presented Officer Matthew Ventura with an award for his quick action and heroism in helping to save Ms. Haury's life. Mr. Jarrett said his great dedication and commitment to the residents of the township is an asset and the Trustees are proud to have him as a Police Officer for Medina Township. Mr. Todd said the best thing about our Township is that everything is a team effort. He said they don't always agree on things but what they do agree on is that every person that represents our township is truly a committed public servant.

Recess

Mr. Todd motioned to take a 5 minute recess. Mr. Jarrett seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Todd, Mr. Jarrett and Mrs. Gardner. The Board recessed at 7:15 pm. Medina Township Board of Trustees reconvened the regular meeting at 7:22 pm. All Board Members and the Fiscal Officer were present.

Approval of Accounts Payables

Mr. Todd motioned to approve warrant #20684 to #20722 totaling \$27,135.00. Mrs. Gardner seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Todd, Mrs. Gardner and Mr. Jarrett.

Approval of Payroll

Mr. Todd motioned to approve payroll check #13880 to #13897 in the amount of \$22,594.96 with total deductions of \$3,360.77. Mr. Jarrett seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Todd, Mr. Jarrett and Mrs. Gardner.

OTHER BUSINESS CON'T

Lawncare Service

Mr. Todd stated that due to the lawncare company cancelling their second year contract with the township, it was necessary to look for another lawncare company as soon as possible. Because the cost is usually under \$19,000.00 the Service Department was able to get quotes from area lawn services. The quotes ranged from \$13,940.00 to \$30,435.00.

Adoption of 2010 Appropriation Measures

After a review and clarification of a few things in the budget the Trustees adopted the budget as attached.

Resolution No. 03182010-006

Mr. Todd motioned to put forth the following resolution to adopt Medina Township's Annual Appropriation Measure for 201, and incorporate the 6 page document by reference with the grand total on the last page of \$2,769,793.00. Mr. Jarrett seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Todd, Mr. Jarrett and Mrs. Gardner.

Approval of Minutes

Mr. Todd motioned to approve the minutes for the March 4, 2010, Public Hearing, March 4, 2010, Regular Meeting and the March 10, 2010, Budget Workshop. Mrs. Gardner seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Todd, Mrs. Gardner and Mr. Jarrett.

Mrs. Gardner motioned to approve the March 9, 2010, Budget Workshop. Mr. Jarrett seconded the motion. Roll call vote: Mrs. Gardner aye, Mr. Jarrett aye and Mr. Todd abstain. Mr. Todd was not at the March 9 workshop.

Purchase Orders and Training Requests

Mr. Jarrett motioned to send Sergeant Zieja to the Amber Alert Conference Tuesday April 20, 2010. Mr. Todd seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Jarrett, Mr. Todd and Mrs. Gardner.

Chief Arbogast said that due to budget constraints he is unable to send the other 2 officers to this conference.

OLD BUSINESS

Parking Violation Policy

Chief Arbogast said the Trustees need to decide how they want to proceed with this policy. He stated that the Medina Municipal Court will not take collect the fines and if there are no fines there is no need to proceed. Mr. Jarrett said he would like to wait until the next meeting and then a decision will be made.

Nettleton Road Culvert Project

Mr. Todd said that the easement has been mailed to Barbara Tilton who said she would sign it and forward it to her sister Carol Beckowitz in the Virgin Islands. He hopes to have this issue resolved by the next Trustees meeting.

Township Limit Signs

Mr. Todd tabled the decision on the Township limit signs until the Trustees review the cost.

OLD BUSINESS CON'T

Electric Aggregation

Mrs. Gardner explained that she is part of the Electric Aggregation Task Force and the issue will come before the County Commissioners at their March 22 meeting for their approval to get it on the ballot. There will then be a link on the Medina Township homepage to the County Commissioners homepage which will have all the information regarding the Electric Aggregation. Mrs. Gardner also said that residents will have the option of opting out of the program.

2010 Census

Mrs. Gardner said that the 2010 Census Forms have been mailed out and encourages all to fill them out and mail them back. She also asked that you assist anyone who needs help filling the form out.

Community Pick-it-up Day

Mr. Todd asked the status of Community Pick-it-up Day. Laurie Shoemaker said Community Pick-it-up-Day will be May 1st, 2010. Mrs. Gardner asked if there would be brightly colored T-Shirts. Chief Arbogast said there has been an anonymous donation for payment of the T-shirts. Mr. Jarrett asked what the time frame was. Chief Arbogast said it will begin around 8:00 or 8:30 am and then all will meet back for lunch at 12 Noon.

NEW BUSINESS

Noise Ordinance/Limited Home Rule Discussion

Mr. Todd said every year he gets a call from a certain resident regarding the dirt bikes that start in the spring and make it difficult for him to enjoy his yard. Mr. Todd explained the Township is limited unless they do a comprehensive noise ordinance and the reason some people move to a township is so they can drive their dirt bikes. It is a balancing act between the Rural Residential and the Urban Residential in the Township. This is a question that he brings up every year and since we have 2 new Trustees he asked for their opinion. Mr. Jarrett and Mrs. Gardner said they would look into it more before making a decision.

S. Weymouth and Remsen Road Intersection

Mrs. Gardner said that because of a fatality at the intersection of S. Weymouth and Remsen Road, letters were received from residents asking Trustees to make it a four-way stop. Three of the roads that come into that intersection are county roads and one is a township road. The County did a study and inspections at the intersection and have agreed to make it a four-way-stop.

Resolution No. 03182010-007

Mr. Todd motioned to put forth a resolution to permit the Medina County Engineers and the Medina County Commissioners to move forward with making the intersection of S. Weymouth and Remsen Roads a four-way-stop. Mrs. Gardner seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Todd, Mrs. Gardner and Mr. Jarrett.

Mr. Todd commended Mrs. Gardner for all the hard work she did in making this issue a reality.

PUBLIC COMMENT

Mr. Todd motioned to open the floor for public comment. Mrs. Gardner seconded the motion.

Erica Graffein, Auditor's Office, said the Board of Revisions (to complain about the value of your property) deadline is March 31, 2010; you must physically be in the office. The Auditor's Office is holding the 2nd Memorial Day Essay Contest for County 6th, 7th and 8th graders. The information can be found on the website. The CAUV farm renewals were due March 1, 2010. Letters now have to be sent out certified to any property owner who did not return the renewal form. If they don't return these forms they will be taken out of the program.

Bill Ostmann (3670 Hamilton Road) said he is opposed to the noise ordinance and home rule.

Matt Galla (3503 Hamilton Road) asked the Police Chief what he does with confiscated weapons. Chief Arbogast said it could be returned to the person if the court says it is to be returned. If it is used in a homicide it is destroyed. But the majority are destroyed when permitted. Mr. Galla also stated that drivers need to pay attention and be careful, put the cell phone and coffee cup away.

Bill Ostmann (3670 Hamilton) said he lives at a corner with a two-way stop and there were 2 serious accidents and now that is a four-way-stop there have been no accidents.

Mr. Todd motioned to close the floor for public comment. Mrs. Gardner seconded the motion.

Mrs. Gardner said Chief Crumley will be out of town and wanted to know if Asst. Chief Kasson is allowed to sign the time sheets. Mr. Todd said he is because he has a title.

Executive Session

Mr. Todd motioned to enter into Executive Session with the Board of Trustees and the Fiscal Officer to discuss employee compensation. Mr. Jarrett seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Todd, Mr. Jarrett and Mrs. Gardner. The Board entered into Executive Session at 8:11 pm. The Board reconvened at 8:31 pm. No decisions were made during that meeting.

Mr. Todd motioned to adjourn the meeting at 8:32 pm. Mr. Jarrett seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Todd, Mr. Jarrett and Mr. Gardner.
