MARKER No. 26:

EXISTING CONDITIONS

- The marker is in poor condition.
- The upper portion of the marble marker has broken off and its location is not currently known (the lower portion is secure in its sandstone base).
- The marble is severely weathered and sugaring, and the partial inscriptions are not legible.
- The monument has settled and the base is covered by deposition.
- The marble is experiencing slight biological growth and staining.

TREATMENT SUMMARY

- A. Excavation/Fragment Recovery
 - 1. Cut back vegetation.
 - 2. Carefully excavate around marker and remove from the ground.
 - 3. Excavate ground in preparation for new compacted gravel foundation.
 - ► the upper portion of the marble marker was not located.
 - uncovered carved/moulded sandstone base
- B. Cleaning
 - 1. For removal of biological growth and general soiling, clean the marble portions and sandstone base with D/2 Architectural Antimicrobial.
 - a. Clean water at low pressure (max 400 psi) and hand-pump sprayer.
 - b. Natural and nylon bristle brushes (varying stiffness and size).
 - c. Avoid dissolution or erosion of the stone.
- C. Re-attachment and Repair
- D. Reset and Level
 - a. Reset marker upon a foundation of compacted gravel to a depth which exposes the carved moulding detail. Ensure top of sandstone base is level.
- E. Site Preparation and Repair
 - 1. Replace soil around base.
