RECORD OF PROCEEDINGS MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING JANUARY 20TH, 2011

The Medina Township Board of Trustees met in regular session at the Medina Township Hall on January 20th 2011, to conduct the business of the Township. President Todd called the meeting to order at 7:14 pm with the following Trustees in attendance: Michel D. Todd, Sarah (Sally) Gardner and Ray Jarrett. Also in attendance were Therese George, Fiscal Officer, Police Chief, Fire Chief, Road Foreman, Sports Field Manager, Zoning Inspector and the general public.

Roll Call

Mr. Todd asked for a roll call of all members present. Trustees present were Mr. Todd, Mrs. Gardner and Mr. Jarrett.

Pledge of Allegiance

Mr. Todd led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Moment of Silence

Mr. Todd asked for a moment of silence for our military personnel at home and overseas.

OTHER BUSINESS

Medina Co. Engineer Representative - Dan Becker Re: Nettleton Road Project

Mr. Becker updated the Trustees on the Nettleton Road Project. He presented Trustees with a copy of the Ohio Public Works Agreement that the Township agreed to in 2008. There were 2 extensions, one in 2009 and 2010. Since that time the price has increased and Denny Miller, Road Foreman, suggested additional work that is needed: an additional guardrail, additional paving repair, milling the road and widening the road from 11 feet wide to 13 feet wide. They are going to change the profile of the road by raising the road approximately 2 feet. The Ohio Public Works Commission will pay approximately \$257,220.00. The Township has to pay the rest. The total project cost is about \$464,640.00. That includes engineering and advertising.

Resolution No. 01202011-006

Mr. Todd motioned to put forth a resolution to set aside \$464,640.00 for the improvement of the Nettleton Road Culvert Project as defined in our agreement with the Medina County Engineer's Office. Mr. Jarrett seconded the motion.

Mr. Todd motioned to amend the motion to say that we have to appropriate \$207,420.00 instead of \$464,460.00. Mr. Jarrett seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Todd, Mr. Jarrett and Mrs. Gardner. Voting aye thereon on the amended motion: Mr. Todd, Mr. Jarrett and Mrs. Gardner.

Work Agreement with Leslie Merrill

Mr. Becker explained the additional work needed on Leslie Merrill's property. He said that the water goes down and makes a sharp 90 degree turn to the north and is hitting the side of the sandstone blocks and then continues down to the east and through the current structure. They would like to clean up the inlet. Mr. Merrill approved and said it was alright to go all the way back to have a straight structure. Mrs. Gardner attended a meeting with Dan Becker, Denny Miller, Jeff Van Loon and Jim Deeter from the Soil and Water Conservation District and they agreed with the plan and said it is being restored back to what might have been the original path.

Mr. Todd motioned to approve the work agreement to enter onto Leslie Merrill's property to do some additional work for the channel that goes into the culvert under Nettleton Road. Mrs. Gardner seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Todd, Mrs. Gardner and Mr. Jarrett.

OTHER BUSINESS CON'T

Approval of Temporary Appropriations for 2011

Mr. Todd motioned to approve the appropriation status for Medina Township, the temporary appropriations, and incorporate the document dated January 19, 2011, by reference. Mrs. Gardner seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Todd, Mrs. Gardner and Mr. Jarrett.

Approval of Accounts Payable

Mr. Todd motioned to approve warrant #21528 to warrant #21586 in the amount of \$131,612.31. Mr. Jarrett seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Todd, Mr. Jarrett and Mrs. Gardner

Approval of Payroll

Mr. Todd motioned to approve payroll check #14699 to payroll check #14721 total amount of \$26,109.70 with a total of \$4,643.63 going to union dues, deferred comp, garnishment fees, OPERS and post tax health deductions. Mr. Jarrett seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Todd, Mr. Jarrett and Mrs. Gardner.

Bank Reconciliation Approval for December, 2010

Mr. Todd motioned to approve the primary bank reconciliation dated December 30, 2010, for the month of December 30, 2010. Mrs. Gardner seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Todd, Mrs. Gardner and Mr. Jarrett.

Approval of Minutes

Mr. Todd motioned to approve the minutes for the January 4, 2011, organizational meeting, the January 6, 2011, regular meeting and the January 12, 2011, special meeting. Mr. Jarrett seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Todd, Mr. Jarrett and Mrs. Gardner.

REPORTS

Road Department

Denny Miller, Road Foreman, reported that for the month of December 2010, the department plowed and salted roads; cleaned and maintained vehicles as needed; fixed and replaced signs; ordered 476.74 tons of salt; fixed mailboxes damaged by plows; started on waterline project at service department building; met with Illes Architects to go over plans for paths at Blakslee Park; picked up dead deer; handled 1 burial; installed 40 "weight reduction" signs due to Engineer's Office no longer offering this service.

Fire Department

Chief Crumley reported that for the month of December 2010, the department responded to 35 incidents and 22 fire inspections (see attached). The Chief said the department assisted with Shop with a Cop and they held Christmas in the Township. Parker Browne has been asked to become a trainer for the SAFER Grant that was received by the State of Ohio.

Police Department

Chief Arbogast received a call from the DEA asking the department to participate in the prescription drug program Saturday, April 30, 2011. He also reported on the number of calls for service (see attached).

Zoning Department

Elaine Ridgley, Zoning Inspector, reported that for the month of December 2010, 9 permits were issued as follows:

Department Purchase Orders and Training Requests

Mrs. Gardner motioned for a purchase order requisition for Warren Fire Equipment for an addition to an existing purchase order (148-2010). The amount went over \$244.40 over the original amount of the purchase order for Scott cylinder and valve assembly. Mr. Todd seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mrs. Gardner, Mr. Todd and Mr. Jarrett.

Mrs. Gardner motioned for a purchase order for Medina County TRT in care of Medina County Emergency Management for the 2011 Technical Rescue Operations Team allocation, \$1746.57. Mr. Todd seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mrs. Gardner, Mr. Todd and Mr. Jarrett.

Mrs. Gardner motioned for the appropriation for \$350.00 for Alliss Strogin to attend the Ohio Township Association Conference in Columbus February 9, 10 and 11. The total cost is \$700.00 and Lafayette Township will be paying half of it for Alliss. Mr. Jarrett seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mrs. Gardner, Mr. Jarrett and Mr. Todd.

Mrs. Gardner motioned for an appropriation for \$90.00 class fees for Rick Bromley to attend the fire investigation at Ashland University at the Northern Ohio Arson Seminar on February 26 and 27, 2011. Mr. Todd seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mrs. Gardner, Mr. Todd and Mr. Jarrett.

Mrs. Gardner motioned for an appropriation for no money to send Jonathon DeVault to a "Handling of Air Bags, Dealing with Hybrid Crashes & New Technology in Automobiles" at the Cleveland IX Center on March 3. There is also one for Blaine Schooley. Mr. Todd seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mrs. Gardner, Mr. Todd and Mr. Jarrett.

OLD BUSINESS

Tabled Items

Mr. Todd tabled the following items until the next meeting: Frontier Land Lines, LST Contract, Comprehensive Plan and the Township Newsletter.

SPCA Invoice

The SPCA invoice will be handled during the budget process.

Lawn Maintenance Contract

Denny Miller, Road Foreman will get the dates for the ads and opening of Lawn Maintenance Bids by the next Trustees meeting.

Police Levy Resolution

Resolution No. 01202011-007

Mr. Todd motioned to put forth a resolution stating that Whereas, The amount of taxes which may be raised within the ten (10) mill limitation will be insufficient to provide an adequate amount for the necessary requirements of said Medina Township, Medina County, Ohio, therefore be it Resolved by the Board of Trustees of the Township of Medina, Medina County, Ohio, two-thirds (2/3) of all members elected thereto concurring, that it is necessary to levy a tax in excess of the ten (10) mill limitation for the benefit of Medina Township for the purpose of Police Protection, motor vehicles, communications, payment of salaries or other equipment used directly in the operation of a Police Department at a rate not exceeding three (3) mills for each one (1) dollar of valuation, which amounts to three (3) dollars for each one hundred (100) dollars of valuation, for and which levy is a renewal of an existing levy of one (1) mill and an increase of two (2) mills to constitute a tax of three (3) mils and also be it resolved that the question of levying additional taxes be submitted to the electors of said Medina Township at the Primary election to be held at the usual voting places within said Medina Township on the third (3rd) day of May, 2011, and be it further resolved that said levy be placed upon the tax list of the current year after the February settlement next succeeding the election, if majority of the electors voting thereon vote in the affirmative. Mrs. Gardner seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Todd, Mrs. Gardner and Mr. Jarrett.

Mr. Todd motioned to amend the resolution to place the Police Department Levy on the ballot to include the following language: Resolved, that the Fiscal Officer of this Medina Township be and she is hereby directed to certify a copy of this Resolution to the Board of Elections, Medina County, Ohio, and notify said Board of Elections to cause notice of election on the question of levying said tax to be given as required by law. Mr. Jarrett seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Todd, Mr. Jarrett and Mrs. Gardner.

Newspapers

Mrs. Gardner said the Post had sent a yellow card asking residents to opt in or out of receiving the paper. She contacted the gentleman who had a complaint regarding the free newspapers being thrown in his driveway. She forwarded the card and the information for the other papers to him.

NEW BUSINESS

Insurance Opt Out for Employees

Mr. Todd said employees who don't take the health insurance are entitled to opt out compensation. Mr. Miller said there was an increase in insurance rates and he would like an adjustment in his opt out compensation amount. This will be discussed in Executive Session.

Friends of Medina Township

Linda DeHoff said wanted to give back to the Township. She worked on a grant for the Parks with Jeff Kessler. Mr. Kessler told her that another community had developed a non-profit to raise funds for their parks. She spoke with Don Kuenzer who did fund raising for the Zoological Society and the Metroparks Zoo for 46 years. She also has the services of a lawyer, William West and his wife Jackie. They are getting all their paperwork together for the status of a 501C3 so they can apply for grants that the township otherwise would not be able to apply for. She required a letter from the Trustees approving of this endeavor. The Trustees will talk to Mr. Thorne, Prosecutor's Office, and ask if the Trustees can send a joint letter or if they need to send individual letters. Mr. West said if anyone is interested in joining this group or if they know of anyone who would like to join please let them know. They do not want anyone who is an elected official of the Township or who is sitting on any of the Boards.

NEW BUSINESS CON'T

Medina Creative Housing Letter

Mr. Todd read the letter received from Medina Creative Living III/ Medina Creative Housing (see attached) regarding the development's impact on the community or if there are any objections. Mr. Todd turned the Chairmanship over to Mrs. Gardner regarding the letter from Medina Creative Housing because he is on their Board. Mrs. Gardner would like to send a letter of support reinforcing that it has been approved by the Township and stating they are happy to have them in the Township.

Asphalt at Maintenance Building 3718 Weymouth Road

Mr. Todd motioned to approve the proposal dated Wednesday, January 5, 2011, from Perrin Asphalt Concrete for \$3,850.00 for the maintenance building to clean entire area to be sealed of dirt and loose debris; clean cracks thoroughly and apply hot pour rubberized crackfiller to major cracks in excess of ¼" wide; spray apply two (2) coats of Sealmaster commercial grade sealer consisting of three (3) pounds of sand per gallon of sealer and 1% latex additive for durability; restripe parking lot area per the existing layout. Mr. Jarrett seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Todd, Mr. Jarrett and Mrs. Gardner.

PUBLIC COMMENT

Mr. Todd motioned to open the floor for public comment. Mrs. Gardner seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Todd, Mrs. Gardner and Mr. Jarrett.

Bill Ostmann (3670 Hamilton Road) commented on the number of animals that were picked up in Medina Township by the SPCA. Mrs. Gardner is investigating this and found that at least 69 of those animals were not picked up in Medina Township.

Dianna Huffman (4025 Remsen Road) said the Township Official should give the correct cost of the Nettleton Road Culvert Project.

Judy Segedi (2787 Marks Road) discussed the problem she is having with her neighbor and the Police and Sheriff's Department response.

Mr. Todd motioned to close the floor for public comment. Mr. Jarrett seconded the motion.

Executive Session

Mr. Todd motioned to enter into Executive Session with the Board of Trustees and Fiscal Officer, Therese George, to discuss employee compensation at 8:46 pm. The Board reconvened from Executive Session at 9:37 pm. No decision was made during that meeting.

Mr. Todd motioned to adjourn the meeting at 9:38 pm. Mr. Jarrett seconded the motion. Voting aye thereon: Mr. Todd, Mr. Jarrett and Mrs. Gardner.






